YEAR (COVID-19 SURGE PROTOCOLS)

The purpose of this Interoffice Correspondence (IOC) is to provide administrators with guidance regarding COVID-19 Exposure Management protocols and procedures during the current Omicron surge period. This updates the IOC entitled *Revised Guidance Regarding COVID-19 Exposure Management for 2nd Semester of the 2021-22 Academic Year, dated January 14, 2022.

**These guidelines are revised to reflect updated isolation and quarantine requirements in alignment with CDF recommendations and the latest California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH) Health Orders as of January 18, 2022. The new guidelines are designed to simplify case identification and exportant management during the current Omicron surge. Guidelines are subject to change with updated Health Orders and fewhen LACDPH determines surge protocols are no longer active.

Exposure Management and Community Engagement

Exposure management is an outcome of a positive COVID-19 case being identified at a Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) site. In partnership with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH), LAUSD's Community Engagement (CE) team monitors all positive cases that have recently been on an LAUSD site. The CE team supports Site Administrators to help ensure that all positive cases are isolated in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, and Expositive cases during their infectious period (48 hours prior to the date of the test if asymptomatic or the date of symptom onset, whichever came first) are quantined if necessary.

Fully Vaccinated: For the protocols described in this IOC, both students and employees
are considered to be "fully vaccinated" two weeks after completing their primary
COVID-19 vaccine series (two doses of Pfizer or Moderna, or a single dose of Johnson &
Johnson)

COVID 19 Symptoms

- Fever or Chills
- New Cough Not from Asthma/Allergies
- Difficulty Breathing
- Fatigue
- Runny or Stuffy Nose
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Body Aches
- Headache especially with a fever
- Sore Throat
- New Loss of Taste or Smell



What's NEW?

- No more Individual Contact Tracing → School will contact the entire group/class of potential exposure of a positive case
- Students are REQUIRED to wear a well-fitted, non-cloth mask.
 - Surgical-grade mask
 - N95 or KN95
- <u>Asymptomatic</u> TK-12 students will not need to be identified as close contact if exposed to a positive case in a school setting (No need to quarantine)
- Students exempted from Quarantine if:
 - Fully Vaccinated
 - Recovered from a confirmed positive test in the past 90 days

Definitions

- Fully Vaccinated
 - For Both Employees and students
 - <u>Two weeks</u> after second dose of vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) or single dose of Johnson & johnson.

Confirmed Positive Case

- Isolate for 10 days. Return on Day 11.
- Shorten Isolation:
 - Isolate for 5 days. Take antigen rapid test on/after day 5.
 - Negative and No Symptom: can return to school
 - Positive and/or symptoms continues: complete 10 days isolation




Close Contact - EXEMPTED from Quarantine

- Fully Vaccinated
- Recovered from COVID-19 in the last 90 days
- Asymptomatic
- Exposed to a positive case in a school setting AND Asymptomatic

- Monitor symptoms
 - If individual develop symptoms → start isolation

Close Contact - Quarantine at Home

- Non-TK-12 students
- Symptomatic close contact
- With household exposure who are not fully vaccinated or recovered from COVID-19 in the past 90 days

- Quarantine for 10 days
- Shorten Quarantine
 - Asymptomatic
 - Test on/after Day 5
 - Negative + No Symptoms Return to school on Day 6
 - Positive → ISOLATION

Household Close Contact (unable to isolate)

Positive individual have the negative antigen test (on/after day 5)




The Day Positive individual can return to school = Day 1

Eligible to return with negative test on/after day 6




COVID-19 Test

- Continue with weekly PCR test
- District Testing Sites will only distribute rapid test to the following:
 - Employees and students with a recent positive test result
 - Expose household members of positive employees
- Antigen rapid test results need to be uploaded to Daily Pass
 - Name
 - Student ID (if have it)
 - Birthday
 - Date of the test

At Home Rapid Self Test



Test to return

Positive Cases	Close Contact
Antigen Rapid Test	PCR (recommended) or Antigen Rapid Test

We are <u>highly recommending</u> student taking the **PCR test** as it is more accurate compared to the Antigen Rapid Test. (It can be either false positive or false negative...)
Antigen Rapid Test should only be used by individuals who tested positive.
